

Rosetown Lady Dies Following Long Illness

Death came on Saturday, Sept. 20th, to Goldie Belle Robinson, beloved wife of George Robinson, of Rosetown, following a long illness. At the time of her death she was 56 years, 7 months and 4 days of age.

She was a highly respected lady and before her long illness she had taken an active part in the activities of her church and in other community affairs.

Deceased was born at Easton's Corners, Ont. She came west with her husband and family in 1912, residing at Langham, Sask., and Saskatoon. In 1916 they moved to Rosetown, where they resided ever since.
