

Aged Citizen Dies From a Protracted Illness

Another familiar figure passed from Rosetown on Saturday night, Dec. 22nd, when the death occurred of Richard Brownbridge at the age of 83 years, 8 months and 14 days. The deceased became widely known during his close to eighteen years' residence here and had gained many friends. He had been in ill health for several years and for a long term was confined to his home. Through all his suffering he retained a bright intellect and conversed quite cheerily with his visitors, who marvelled at his brightness of mind and memory. The deceased was born at North Augusta, Grenville Co., Ont., and prior to his coming west to Rosetown in 1911 had spent 35 years in the hotel business in Lyndhurst and Brockville.

He is survived by four sons and three daughters—John D. Brownbridge, Birsay; Lawrence T. Brownbridge, Rosetown; Richard W. Brownbridge, Rosetown; Claude Brownbridge, Edmonton; Mrs. T. A. Sheffield, Rosetown; Mrs. Geo. F. Robinson, Rosetown, and Miss Nellie Brownbridge, Rosetown. He was predeceased by his wife twelve years ago. The funeral services were held at Chas. Taylor's funeral parlors on Monday, Dec. 24th, and interment took place in the Rosetown Cemetery. The floral tributes were many and beautiful.
