

Death Comes Suddenly to William Brownbridge

Death invaded our business section on Tuesday when Wm. L. Brownbridge passed away. The suddenness of his passing was a shock to the community. He had been in poor health for about six months, but it was only known recently that the cause was cancer of the stomach and that his condition was serious and he had but a few more weeks to live. His death, however, came considerably earlier than was expected. He was 54 years, 6 months and 17 days of age. The deceased was born in Frankville, Leeds Co., Ont., and came west twenty years ago to Saskatoon. In 1912 he went to Kelfield, coming to Rosetown six years ago to live and go into business. In 1912 in Saskatoon he married Miss Emily James, of Springhill, N.S., and to the union were born six children, Albert, John, Doreen, Elva, Bob and Dick, who together with his wife survive him. He also is survived by his father, Richard Brownbridge, Rosetown, and four brothers, John, of Birsay; Lawrence, of Rosetown; Richard, of Regina, and Claude, of Edmonton, and three sisters, Mrs. G. F. Robinson, Mrs. T. A. Sheffield and Miss Nellie Brownbridge, all of Rosetown. The funeral was held today from Chas. Taylor's funeral parlors. Services were held in the Anglican Church and were attended by the Elks, who performed the last sad rites at the graveside in the Rosetown Cemetery. The floral tributes were many and beautiful.
